
SOMACORE Seascape Recommendations to SOM

- Reiterating that the CTI-CFF Seascapes General Model and Regional Framework for Priority Seascapes emphasizes seascapes as a tool for large-scale marine management that can both build a consistent framework for sustainable management as well as provide a platform for future investment,
- The SOMACORE Consortium Partners commend the CT6 for taking crucial steps towards the implementation of the model, by conducting the first priority seascapes dialogues aimed at developing a joint vision for the cooperation in the seascapes.
- The SOMACORE partners are committed to accompany multi-country engagement in the 3 priority seascapes, including learning exchanges and dialogue among seascapes stakeholders, towards the CT6 vision of possible future seascape governance mechanisms.
- In this spirit the SOMACORE Consortium Partners welcome the recommendation put forward by the Seascape TWG to review and integrate all TWG workstreams and activities in consideration of the Seascapes General Model and Framework.
